We hope that this article template will simplify the article submission process. Please note that we strongly recommend to fill all fields, listed below. More information on article format (references, tables, visual material) you can get in the corresponding section of the “Russian Arctic” website.

The main text of the article should not exceed 20-40 thousands characters including spaces. Article structure should contain the following sections: methods, results, discussion and conclusion.

Citations and references should be made out in the form of serial numbers in square brackets [1], [2], [3-4]. Self-citation should not exceed 15% of the total number of links.

It is recommended to include visual materials in the article text: tables and figures. The link to the table or figure is made in parentheses: (Fig. 1) and (Table 1). When issues typesetting, the quality of the drawings placed in .doc files is lost. Drawings should be sent as separate files in JPG / PNG format with a resolution of at least 300 dpi for better articles display.

References list:

The text of the scientific work should refer to articles, books, collections of materials, scientific and technical reports, dissertations, patents, regulatory documents. It is forbidden to refer to materials, the authorship of which cannot be established, or near-scientific Internet resources. The number of links can vary from 10 to 30. The following are examples of bibliographic references in APA format:

2. James, S. A. (2001, June 7). Magazine articles in APA format. *Newsweek*, 20, 48-52.
